

The U.S. department of Homeland Security and the U.S. customs and border protection inform the traveling public that as of January 31, 2008:

All adult travelers will be required to present proof of citizenship such as a Birth certificate, and a proof of identity such as a drivers license when entering the Unites States through land and sea ports of entry. Ages 19 and older a government-issue photo I D, along with proof of citizenship, such as birth certificate or naturalization certificate.

- Children ages 18 and Younger Proof of citizenship, such a birth certificate.
- Oral declarations of citizenship alone will no longer be accepted.
- All existing nonimmigrant visa and passport requirements will remain in effect and will not be altered by this change

Below you will find the valid documentation

Identification Documents:

- Driver's license or Identification card issue by a Federal, state, provincial, country, territory or municipal authority.
- U.S or Canadian military identification card.

All identification documents must have a photo, name and date of birth.

Citizenship Documents:

U.S. or Canadian Birth certificate issued by a Federal, State, provincial, country, territory or municipal authority.

U.S consular report of Birth abroad

U.S. certificate of naturalization

U.S. certificate of citizenship

U.S. citizen identification card

Canadian citizenship card

Canadian certificate of citizenship without photo

Travelers who do not present one of the documents listed may be delayed as U.S. customs and border protection officers attempt to verify their citizenship and identity.
